Salesians of Don Bosco

Who Are We?

When St. John Bosco, popularly known as Don (Father) Bosco, began his work in 1841 for poor and abandoned boys, he gathered lay men and women and fellow diocesan priests to help him. In time he also invited some of his better boys, now as young men, to stay and help him. Many felt called to the priesthood and others to a consecrated lay state. This led Don Bosco to found the Society of St. Francis de Sales for brothers and priests (Salesian Society) and the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (Salesian sisters) for the care of girls. Continuing to encourage others to do what they can for his mission to young people, he began the Association of Mary Help of Christians and Salesian Cooperators. He put these groups and all his work under the patronage of St. Francis de Sales, inspired especially by his gentleness, kindness and zeal for the good of others. Today there are 32 groups who belong to the Salesian Family of St. John Bosco, working in a united effort for the good of poor boys and girls, young adults and those most in need.

Salesians of Don Bosco Summer Apostolates

St. John Bosco developed a model of youth ministry that he called the Oratory. It features a family atmosphere, an educational component, a faith experience and a social and recreational side, succinctly termed home-school-church-playground, all imbued with the Salesian spirit. Many of the works of the Salesians of Don Bosco in Canada and the Eastern USA run summer Oratory-style camps. Sports, crafts, talent shows and outings get the greatest attention. Each program also offers catechetical sessions, celebration of the sacraments and daily prayer. Camp traditions and friendly, caring staffs make the campers feel welcomed and at home. The educational component enters subtly with the building of skills through the recreational activities.

St Francis de Sales Association

Who Are We?

The Society of the Daughters of Saint Francis de Sales was founded in France in 1872, by Father Henri Chaumont and Caroline Carré de Malberg. Father Chaumont envisioned the association as a school of continuous formation for deepening conversion in view of the apostolate. Today we are called the St Francis de Sales Association. The association is comprised of two branches:the St Francis de Sales Association (lay) and the Salesian Missionaries of Mary Immaculate (religious). Our association is international and is for lay women who are living according to the teachings of the Church and desire to be grounded in the Gospel and formed by the teachings of St Francis de Sales. It offers the opportunity to develop life-long spiritual friendships. "Accompaniment" is an important facet. Each Daughter has a companion. Companions accompany one another on their spiritual journey.

The Association of Salesian Cooperators – Canada

Who Are We?

The Salesian Cooperators are single or married lay men and women, or diocesan clergy, who dedicate themselves to the welfare of young people, and live guided by Don Bosco's Salesian Spirit.

Generally the Salesian Cooperators are affiliated with a local Salesian school, parish and youth center. Some of the Cooperators work directly in Salesian ministries while others serve in their parishes or other ministries. Some Cooperators do not work directly with any particular ministry, but bring the Salesian Spirit to their work place, profession, and family.

The core of the Salesian Cooperators' commitment is to live his or her life as a good Christian and a good Catholic. The Salesian Cooperator embraces a Gospel way of life, sharing in the Church's mission to bring Christ to society, especially the young.

Visitation Salesian Network (VSN) Sponsors Student Pilgrimage to Visitation holy places in France

In June, 29 students and 8 chaperones from Georgetown Visitation Preparatory School in Washington, D.C., Visitation Academy in Saint Louis, MO, and Visitation School in Mendota Heights, MN, spent a week exploring the roots of Salesian Spirituality at La Sainte Source in Annecy. The Visitation Salesian Network (VSN) sponsored this new experience for youth as one way for lay educators and student leaders of our three Visitation school communities in the United States to carry the charism forward into the future.

The first afternoon was spent working with the Visitation Sisters on their farm and praying Vespers alongside them. After Sunday Mass, the Sisters invited us into the Parlor to see their Vow Book which contained the handwritten vows of the members of their community back to Saint Jane de Chantal.







Other important Visitation sites included Les Allinges, where St. Francis de Sales preached to Calvinists in the Chablais; Thoren, Francis' childhood home where he had a vision of Jane de Chantal and the other women who would help found the Visitation order; the Hermitage of Saint Germaine in Talloires, where Francis had hoped to retire; and the Galerie House, the location of the very first Visitation community.

We also took a day trip to Paray-le-Monial and celebrated the 350th Jubilee Year of the Sacred Heart. We attended Mass for the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul and were warmly welcomed into the Sisters' courtyard to learn more about Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque from the whole community. After a wonderful encounter, the Sisters brought out ice cream treats to share!

Students spent their days immersing themselves in Salesian Spirituality and we had a lot of fun getting to know new VISters (fond term for students from the other Visitation schools). We tasted lots of gelato, went to the beach to swim, and went paddle boating on Lake Annecy. This amazing trip leaves our students well-prepared to share Salesian Spirituality with their respective school communities in new ways this year.








Salesian Spirit was present at the 10th National Eucharistic Congress

"Bloom where you are planted" is the very familiar motto given to us by St. Francis de Sales. It was a blessing to be present at the 10th National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis July 17-21, where Catholics of all vocations and walks of life gathered in Indianapolis to adore, praise and grow deeper in their love and understanding of the Eucharistic mystery.

As part of the US Conference of Secular Institutes vocations committee, I was able to share the beauty of the vocation of secular institutes through my experience as a member of the DeSales Secular Institute. We attracted many people to our booth at the expo hall with Embraced by God's "Droplets" featuring beautiful imagery on one side of a business size card and inspirational quotes from St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane de Chantel on the flip side. People were quick to snatch up the pocket booklets "Anxiety Relief" and "Transforming Violence to Gentleness" as well as the late Fr. John Graden's "Really Present? Jesus in the Eucharist booklet. It was a joy to educate people on how members of our secular institute can consecrate our lives to the Lord wherever he places us in the secular world, in order to bring people back to Christ, and to the Eucharist.

It was especially meaningful for me since it took place in my hometown of Indianapolis and my parish church, St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church, became the perpetual adoration chapel throughout the duration of the Congress. During my volunteer shift there in the late afternoon and early evening, it was standing room only. It was particularly moving to see small children take roses up to the foot of the monstrance during the Family Adoration Hour, and then kneel before the Lord in loving, childlike adoration. To see so many walks of life represented, priests, bishops, religious, lay people, married couples, children, parents with babies, people from other countries, was truly a blessing of visible unity.








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
